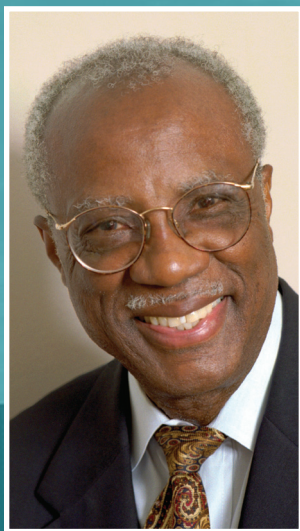

James A. Banks holds the Kerry and Linda Killinger Endowed Chair in Diversity Studies and is Founding Director of the Center for Multicultural Education at the University of Washington, Seattle. He is a past President of the American Educational Research Association (AERA) and a specialist in social studies education and in multicultural education. Professor Banks has written more than 100 articles and written or edited 20 books which have been translated into Greek, Japanese, Chinese and Korean. His most recent book is entitled, *Diversity and Citizenship Education: Global Perspectives; Teaching Strategies for Ethnic Studies*. James Banks' fundamental principles for developing inclusive curriculum have been a foundation for equity work across many school districts and teacher education programs in Ontario.

**Judy Rebick**  
*Occupy Education*

Judy Rebick is a well-known Canadian social justice activist, writer, educator and speaker. She is currently the Eakin Fellow in Canadian Studies at McGill University. Previously she held the CAW Sam Gindin Chair in Social Justice and Democracy at Ryerson University. She is also part of the Media panel on CBC radio's Q. Her latest book is *Transforming Power: From the Personal to the Political*. Judy Rebick is the founding publisher of *rabble.ca*, Canada's well known independent online news and discussion site, she is perhaps best known to Canadians as a former president of the National Action Committee on the Status of Women, Canada's largest women's group.
