

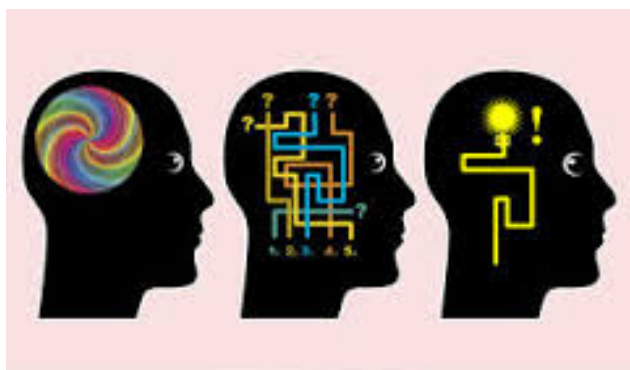

**Admission Requirements:**

- Minimum undergraduate grade of “B”
- Statement of academic and professional interests; naming at least 2 faculty members whose interests are closest to your own  
Two letters of reference; at least one university reference on your academic capacity
- A year of relevant work, community or volunteer experience is highly desirable



**Degree Requirements:** MA students must complete at least half of their courses from the AECD Program

**Required Courses:** LHA1100H Introduction to Adult Education or LHA1102 Community Development: Innovative Models, as well as LHA1183H Master’s Research Seminar

**Minimum Degree Cost (2 years) = \$14,120 + student fees. Based on 2015/2016 academic year**
