OUR PROGRAM

OISE's Comparative, International & Development Education (CIDE) Collaborative Program is Canada's pre-eminent program for the study of global issues in education. More than one hundred and fifty graduate students and two dozen faculty are active in the program and come to OISE from all parts of the world. They bring with them a wealth of international academic and field experience. Our graduates go on to careers in international development organizations, universities, Ministries of Education, and other educational organizations.

CIDE spans a wide range of theoretical and practical issues: from the study of ethnicity and identity to issues of globalization and global

governance; from non-formal learning, community development and citizenship education to concrete problems of educational reform, social equality, language education, conflict resolution, teacher development, and community development. Some of the world's most renowned scholars in the field of comparative and international education work at CIDE.

CIDE students can also participate in an exciting range of seminars and workshops on cutting-edge international issues at the University of Toronto's Munk Centre for International Studies.

PROGRAM DELIVERY

Students complete an introductory course in international and comparative education, and a number of core and specialized courses in the field. As part of their program, students are encouraged to take independent reading and research courses and a practicum or field internship. Students participate in a bimonthly research seminar series, many cultural events and can join the newly created CIDE students association, which brings together a community of students with international interests. CIDE students can also take courses in political science, development studies, international relations, feminist studies, sociology, anthropology, and geography at the University of Toronto.

Features of the Program:

- All students take a core course, *Introduction to Comparative and International Development Education*
- More than 25 additional CIDE-related courses are offered at OISE
- Educational Administration I: Policy, Leadership and Change
- Individual reading and practicum or field internship courses allow you to customize your program to your own professional needs and interests
- All programs can be taken on a full-time or part-time basis
