## NEW SLE ONLINE MEd COHORT

Our Second Language Education (SLE) Master of Education (MEd) program provides a rich learning experience that integrates theory and practice in second, foreign and minority language education in a wide range of topics and issues in classrooms, schools, multimedia, adult education, work, and communities.

The SLE program's new online MEd cohort accepts approximately 25 candidates and is designed to be completed in just over three years. During this period, three courses per year will be offered exclusively online to the cohort participants in the fall, winter, and summer terms. Graduation from the MEd requires completion of 10 half-courses.

Drawing from the expertise of world-renown researchers, students in the cohort will study:

- Second languages teaching methodologies
- Planning and organizing the second language curriculum
- Current issues in second language education
- Second language assessment
- Second language learning
- Foundations of bilingual and multicultural education
- Discourse analysis
- Practicum in second language education
- Two optional courses related to online teaching or other educational interests

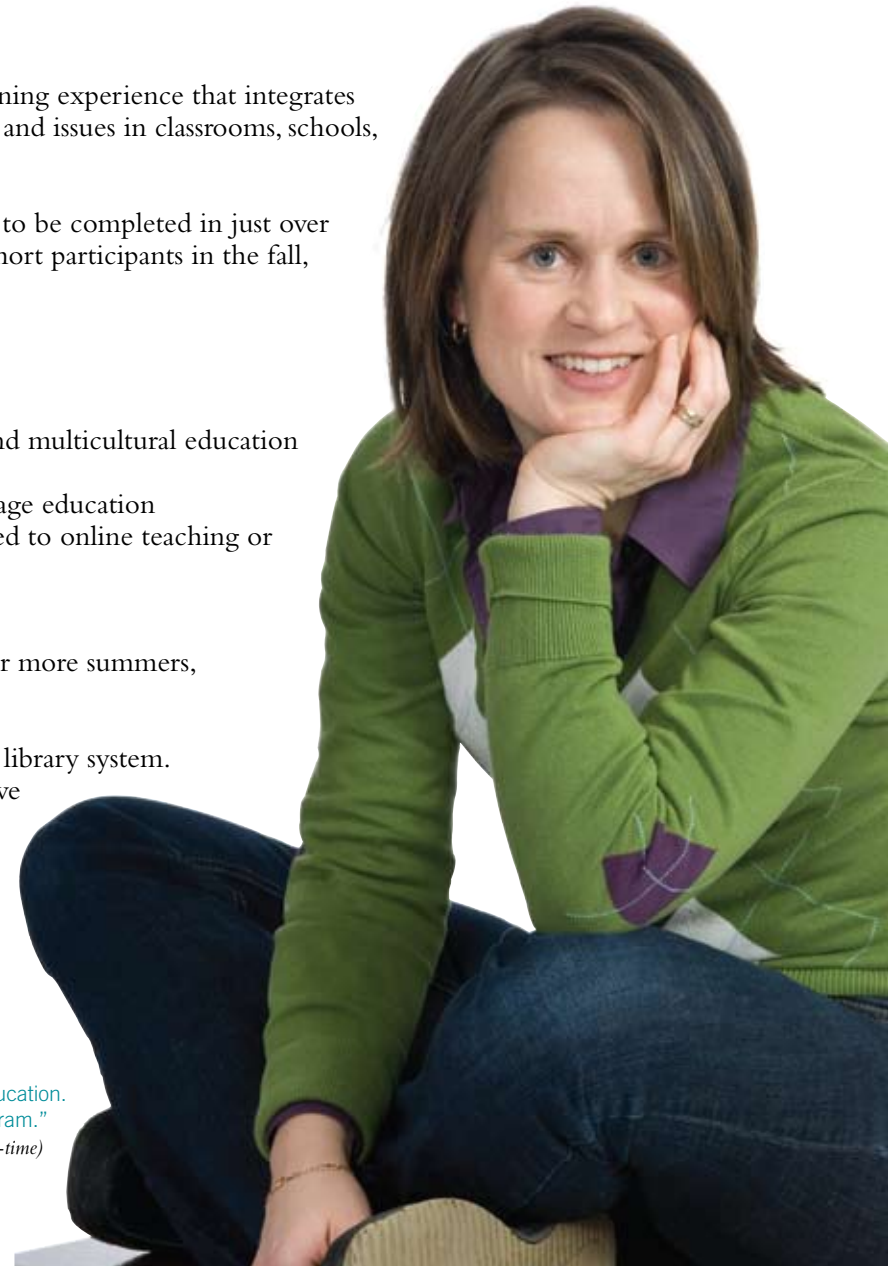
Courses will be offered entirely online. For participants wishing to study in Toronto during one or more summers, optional courses are available at OISE on the University of Toronto campus.

Students will have access to a full range of electronic resources through the University of Toronto library system. The Modern Language Centre resource collection of the OISE library is one of the most extensive collections of materials about language teaching and learning in the world.

For over forty years, the research of professors in the Modern Language Centre has contributed major theories, policies, and practices for second and foreign language learning, teaching, curriculum development, educational programs, and evaluation in English language, French immersion, heritage language, bilingual, and multilingual education.
