Practicum #1 provides an opportunity for Year 1 TCs to develop an understanding of the students, classroom, school and community, followed by a transition to teaching small groups, and then larger groups and the whole class. During the Practicum Preparation Days, it is suggested that Teacher Candidates (TCs) have an opportunity to: Observe classes (secondary TCs may observe classes within the department and other teachers). Observe the Associate Teacher (AT) teaching lessons as modeling. Identify class/school routines and classroom management strategies. Get to know student names. Work with the AT to develop a schedule of responsibilities for the first weeks of practicum. Engage in a community walk around the school.	Inquiry/Observation/Active Engagement TCs are actively engaged with students and the classroom 100% of the instructional time. This may include one-on-one student support, assisting the AT, engaging in a focussed observation, getting to know students, etc. During non-instructional times, TCs can discuss/plan with AT, as well as look for opportunities to explore and get to know the school and community context. As week progresses TCs can begin to work with small groups of students, and co-planning and co-teaching larger groups or the whole class. TCs draft lesson plans for week #2, seeking feedback from AT on the plans. <u>AT's</u> Support TC development through encouraging TCs to attend to the critically important details of their practice, e.g., observing students, listening to students, etc. Facilitate discussion with TC about expectations for week #2, and provide feedback on lesson plans for week #2.	Begin to take responsibility for ¼ of timetable. Elem = 1-2 lessons/day Sec = 1 class/day Begin to take responsibility for ¼ of timetable by the end of the week. When not teaching formally, TCs should be involved with the students and/or observing the teacher. TCs continue to be actively engaged with students and the classroom 100% of the instructional time, building on expectations from week 1. Explore suitable use of strategies, approaches and skills that have been taught in the OISE courses. AT's Provide daily feedback with a focus on specific constructive comments. Complete Mid-Point Formative Assessment by Friday of 2 nd week). Contact Faculty Advisor or relevant Practicum Coordinator IF TC is "at-risk" of failing.	Continue to take responsibility for ½ of timetable. Elem = 1-2 lessons/day Sec = 1 class/day Begin to display more initiative, confidence & leadership with regards to planning & self- assessment of teaching practice. Continue to explore suitable use of strategies, approaches and skills that have been taught in the OISE courses. AT's provide daily feedback with a focus on specific constructive comments.	Work towards taking responsibility for planning and teaching ½- ⅔ of timetable. Elem = 2-3 lessons/day Sec = 1-2 classes/day Ideally create, administer & evaluate a major assessment task (with significant support from AT). TCs are responsible for grading* work they have assigned, and returning it to the AT within a reasonable time frame in consultation with AT. (*Noting that the AT retains responsibility for grades assigned.) AT's Provide daily feedback with a focus on specific constructive comments. ATs complete and electronically submit the Summative Evaluation by the final day of the practicum. Each TC will complete a Self- Report_ and share it with their AT by Tues. of the final week. ATs are invited to consider the input of the TC in the crafting of the Summative Evaluation.
