description of life histories derived from the Canadian Mental Hygiene Committee (now the Canadian Mental Health Association) longitudinal data base of 1,150 case studies of children adjusting to school and life. These case studies were derived from information gathering points in 1925-1933, 1953-1955, 1981-1985, and 2014- 2015. Most of these children grew up in Toronto, had families, and have left their rich stories with subsequent generations .

DESCRIPTION OF STUDENT PARTICIPATION: Students will have the opportunity to analyze case narratives, process quantitative/qualitative data, participate in lab meetings, learn to apply the BRIO Case Study Framework and the Life Space Wheel.
