








11. Where are the most young kids as a % of the population?




12. Where do kids have the most access to ECE?




13.Who pays the most per child in licensed child care?




14. Where has there been the most growth (%) in regulated child care?




15. Where do schools provide ECE? (Pre-kindergarten)




