

## ECE WAGE RATES COMPARED TO MARKET BASKET MEASURE (MBM) THRESHOLDS FOR 2 ADULTS/2 CHILDREN BY REGION

## **ABOUT THIS CHART**

This chart assesses the adequacy of Early Childhood Educator (ECE) wages by region. It compares government-subsidized wage rates for qualified educators working in licensed group child care centres participating in the Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care plan with the most recently available cost of living in their communities.

Calculations are based on government-subsidized wage rates for an ECE with a two-year diploma or equivalent, with approximately 5 years of experience, and working a 7.5-hour day for 261 days a year. Where annual earnings or work hours are reported as part of a wage grid, that amount is used. Not all jurisdictions have mandated wage grids. Those that don't provide a wage subsidy. Subsidies may involve a top-up to the provincial/territorial minimum wage or be an additional hourly amount that governments provide. Many jurisdictions state a minimum rate that an educator may earn. Depending on the jurisdiction, wage subsidies and other wage policies may only apply to qualified ECEs, not support staff. Depending on the employer, some educators may earn more than the government-supported minimums.

The Market Basket Measure (MBM) is Canada's official poverty line, based on the cost of a basket of goods and services representing a basic standard of living for a family of two adults and two children. The MBM is developed by Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) and published annually by Statistics Canada. A family is considered to be living in poverty if they do not have enough income to purchase the basket of goods and services in their community.

Provincial/Territorial minimum wage rates are for information only and are not part of calculations.
