## Important Technology Update

### Homespace Sunsetting Has Begun: Welcome to Office 365 File Storage

As previously announced, OISE's longtime data-storage solution, HomeSpace, is being retired. Phase 1 of that process commenced on Monday, June 15, and HomeSpace is now read-only. That means existing files can be opened or downloaded, but not edited, renamed, or deleted, and no new files can be created or uploaded.



**A Message From Education Commons:** We welcome you to OneDrive and SharePoint as your new, improved file storage solutions. We recommended that individuals begin transitioning files from HomeSpace to OneDrive ASAP, and that those who use Homespace to share departmental files begin to transition that data to SharePoint via your departmental champion. Please act as quickly as possible, as Homespace data is set to become unavailable after September 8. Education Commons is here to help you through this change. 

## U of T COVID-19 Student Engagement Award

LHAE PhD students Michael O'Shea (Principal Investigator) and Leping Mou (Co-applicant) are recipients of the U of T COVID-19 Student Engagement Award. The award provides financial support to U of T undergraduate and graduate students working in collaboration on project contributing to building and fostering a global community during the COVID-19 pandemic. Their project aims to understand how higher education institutions responded to the pandemic crisis by examining communications from U

of T and other 26 universities from across Canada, China, and the United States. They are interested in how these communications reflect norms, leadership qualities, and the role of HEIs in crisis response across countries. The goal is not only to better understand HEI responses, but also to share practices that may help universities plan or respond to the next pandemic or crisis.

## Two new U of T Libraries services opening!

Beginning June 22, Robarts Library will offer a Curbside Pickup Service for print books *not* available through the [HathiTrust Emergency Temporary Access Service](#). Beginning on June 18, requests for retrievals can be made through the library catalogue, and an email notification will be sent with instructions for pickup. Current students, faculty and staff are eligible.

Please note that for now, the Curbside

Pickup Service will **only provide access to books housed**



*in the Robarts Library* building stacks and storage locations. The service has been designed with the health and safety of staff and users as a key priority. It will be assessed carefully before it is expanded to other campus libraries, such as the OISE Library.

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## Technology Access Service

To meet the needs of current University of Toronto students who require computer and Wi-Fi access for academic work, the Libraries will be providing a Technology Access Service at the Gerstein Science Information Centre starting June 18. Up to twenty students will be able to book a seat each day, during dedicated three-hour windows. The service will be by appointment only and will operate within current public health requirements for physical distancing and other COVID-19 guidelines. The system will be available to make advance bookings starting June 17.
