LHAE Student Exchange in Italy

Led by [Professor Marcelo Vieta](#), OISE's Program in Adult Education and Community Development (AECD), in the Department of Leadership, Higher and Adult Education, has partnered with St. Mary's University (SMU) Master's Program in Cooperative Management in their Study Abroad course in the cooperative capital of the world, [Emilia Romagna, Italy](#).



The program allows OISE students to take an online graduate course at SMU and then spend 10 days with SMU's Cooperative Management students at the University of Bologna Master's in Cooperative Management. All while visiting dozens of the Italian region's worker, consumer, and retail cooperatives.

[Professor Vieta](#), accompanied by M.Ed. students Tyler Dilnot and Daulton Scott, plan to continue the collaboration and invite OISE students to contact him for next year's trip to the Mondragon Cooperatives in the Basque Community of Spain.

Library Collection: Circular 14



The idea of developing an authorized list of textbooks for use in Ontario schools was introduced in the mid-1800s to ensure consistency across schools and to help control the cost of textbooks. The Department of Education (and later the Ministry of Education) published this list of authorized textbooks in a document called [Circular 14](#).
