This award was established by the Waldorf School Association of Ontario on behalf of all Waldorf Schools in Ontario. It is to be awarded to an OISE thesis-track graduate student (MA or Doctoral) enrolled in the Department of Curriculum, Teaching and Learning who submits the highest quality and most relevant proposal for applied research into various experiential, holistic and “hands-on” models of education. Indigenous ways of knowing and learning can also be a lens for analysis. With reference to the expression of Rudolf Steiner’s vision of Waldorf education: Are these curiosity-driven models able to maintain the founder’s creativity and innovation, or do they tend to become static and formulaic? In what ways do the expressions of various models vary from one another, for example, Waldorf schools in different regions and environments? Successful recipients will provide clear plans to empirically measure what difference these kinds of programs make to different outcomes such as:

- The development of problem solving,
- The development of active learner citizens,
- Or key similarities and differences among and between programs
