Professor Michael W. Apple is an internationally-recognized scholar and the author of numerous articles and books, including *Democratic Schools: Lessons in Powerful Education*, Second Ed. (2007), *The Subaltern Speak: Curriculum, Power, and Educational Struggles* (2006), *Educating the "Right" Way: Markets, Standards, God and Inequality*, Second Ed. (2006), *Ideology and Curriculum* (2004), *The State and Politics of Education* (2003), and *Official Knowledge: Democratic Knowledge in a Conservative Age* (2000).

His major interests lie in the relationship between culture and power in education. His current research centers on the limits and possibilities of critical educational policy and practice in a time of conservative restoration. He received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Educational Research Association and the UCLA Medal for Distinguished Academic Achievement.
